Firewall Security | Part Two in a Series

In our February 2004 newsletter we discussed "What is a Firewall?" In this second article in a series we'll begin to explore firewalls in more depth and detail.

Could you be unprotected – or even overly protected – with your current firewall setup? This is very possible if you didn't customize your firewall to fit how you use your computer. Many Internet users just browse the web and send and receive email, while others want to share files with their friends, play real-time games, or possibly even host their own websites.

If you fit the first category, your firewall might not be protecting you as much as it could. Any recent firewalling routers or appliances will allow outgoing connections without need for customization, and most software-based firewalls (such as WinXP SP2 and ZoneAlarm) require only minimal initial setup for your browser and email programs – just make sure you don't enable any of those tempting checkboxes that "allow incoming connections!"

Furthermore, if you're on a home or office network that is protected by a firewalling router – and if you want to be able to share files or printers with other computers on your network – most software-based firewalls enable you to restrict those connections to only those computers within your own network.

However, if you fit the category of those who want to play online games and perhaps host a website, you can have a difficult task ahead of you. Make sure you do *not* enable a router's DMZ option just for hosting a website or game, since that can expose pretty much everything on your computer to access from the Internet.

We would recommend consulting someone with networking experience before trying to configure your router to allow selected incoming connections. Mistakes made in this setup could expose your computer (or all computers on your network) to virus infections and even Internet fraud.

Also, even if you have a firewall configured correctly, make sure to check for and maintain all security updates for your operating system and software, otherwise all of your firewall security efforts could be in vain.

When the weather gets cranky and there's not enough sunshine for the solar power systems used at our remote tower sites, after a few days the batteries need to be recharged.

We're now testing new automated backup generators, but in the meantime getting up to those sites has lately been a challenge. The trails are rough going for 4WD pickups even in the summer, but when they're soaked the clay and mud make them impassable, sometimes even for quad ATVs – we tumbled one of those down a steep slope recently.

On a few occasions it's even been necessary to hike up and back, which in the rain and fog is quite an adventure. But the alternative is that customers with service from those towers would eventually go down, and we simply won't settle for that. Like the old post office motto, "neither rain nor snow

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nor dark of night..." – (we've done that too) – shall interrupt service to our customers, we're committed to doing whatever it takes.

On one occasion our Lindsay tower needed recharging but we had no generator, charger, or fuel up there. None of our vehicles could make the climb, and hiking with such loads (although accomplished once) was really impractical – not to mention slow and exhausting.

The only remaining alternative was to fly, despite the weather. Company founder Ted Olson flew helicopters in Vietnam and still holds a commercial license, so one stormy Sunday afternoon in January he rented a Bell Jet Ranger from long-time OCS customer San Joaquin Helicopters in Delano and flew the needed equipment to the top.

Once our new backup generators are in place we'll continue the story. How to get them there while they're still needed this season is a current challenge, which may call for flying again ... *whatever it takes!*
